Euro Convention



# Editorial: Moving Forward

I came across an article in a business magazine which explained what really happens when things stop moving forward.

Let it speak for itself, quotes:  
**“If You Aren’t Moving Forward Positively, You’re Moving Backwards!”**



Why is that? It’s simply explained by one of the basic laws of nature, quote:

“Entropy. *“The inexorable tendency of the universe and any isolated system in it, to slide toward a state of increasing disorder.”*

“Many business leaders fear stagnation – i.e. stop developing, progressing or moving – but I think it is too generous a term for what really occurs.

“When organizations stagnate they do more than simply stay still – they slide into a state of increasing disorder. Change is the only constant, so if you aren’t moving forward positively, you’re moving backward in decline.”

It was explained using the following example, quote:

“Let’s say, you’re a caveman and a rival caveman (let’s face it, they were most probably men) comes along to push you out of your superior cave. You wrestle for a bit, but one of you grabs a large club-like branch and whacks the other over the head. That’s an “innovation”. The beaten caveman returns to his inferior cave

*and fashions himself a club, so that he is better prepared next time. When challenged again, the fight is more equally balanced until time moves on and clubs turn to swords. Swords do a more potent job of disposing of a caveman than a stick. One day, someone thinks it would be a great idea to fashion not only a sword out of metal but a shield out of metal too, again an innovation that protects the defenceless side of the body from attack.*

*But now a “contradiction” has occurred. Whereas before, both arms could be used to attack and defend, now one arm has become ‘trapped’ behind a shield. So innovation occurs again to solve this contradiction, a suit of armour emerges from the creative mind in order to free both arms for fighting, yet protect the body from stabs.*

*Alas, a new contradiction has occurred – what was once agile and light, is now heavy and slow. Innovation must rise again in order to overcome this challenge, and chainmail armour is created. So, each innovation occurs to overcome the contradiction incurred by the innovation of the past”.*

*“So, as each contradiction is overcome and solved with another innovation, we come closer to a perfect solution. When this is achieved there is no need for innovation as all problems will be solved”.*

Isn’t that the whole story of the human race? Most progress is due to making better weapons to kill others. Right now we see another cold war heating up with 13% of all the combined world capital being used in this way.

On the other hand we see church history repeating itself again and again.

It’s so easy to accept “stagnation” and perhaps give it another name to make it sound better.

We can find all sorts of reasons for it. In business we can blame the economy, the up-coming election, the fear of a Brexit etc.

The Bible is full of stories of “stagnation”; church history is full of the same stories.

However, God’s plan does not depend on human weaknesses. It will go on, with - or without our personal involvement.

Personally I find this very exciting, a personal challenge to progress to that point, repeat quote:

*“So, as each contradiction is overcome and solved with another innovation, we come closer to a perfect solution. When this is achieved there is no need for innovation as all problems will be solved”.*

That is the point where we can rise to meet the Lord in the air.







## Testimonies



It is coming up to 32 years since I was born again. We were not a family who went to church, so as children, my brother and I were never forced to go. We immigrated to Australia in 1992 where my mother was witnessed to three times. In 1994 she went along to the fellowship and was born again. I saw something different about her after that and I went along with her the following week. I got baptised and received the Holy Spirit three weeks later.

My father was raised from the dead a few months after he got born again which was a wonderful blessing. I have been healed from depression after going through a difficult period in my life. My doctor advised me to either get counselling or take anti-depressants so I chose to go to a counsellor who only made me feel worse. I then took anti-depressants, but after a few days I realised that things wouldn't get better if I didn't look to the Lord, so I got on my knees and prayed until I felt the peace that passes all understanding. I have been able to share this testimony with others to help them and even pray with some of them. The Lord has always provided for me and won't let me down when I look to Him.

I grew up in Australia and have been born again for 20 years. My grandparents were born again 40 years ago and my parents followed, so I am one of the fortunate children who have grown up in the fellowship. I didn't know that other children didn't live like we did until I was older and realised how different we were.
